#### How to use the map

This map is designed to give you information about your chosen major that will help keep you on track for graduation within 4 years. The introductory sections will help orient you to "big picture" ideas like the topics and areas of interest inside your major, the kinds of courses you will take, university policies including admissions, and other general topics. The chart on the second page will help you to develop a productive plan to make the most of your 4 years at ECU and prepare yourself for the job market after graduation.

Remember, it is important that you diversify your experiences, for success both in your degree program and after graduation. While coursework is critically important, it should not be your only focus. The chart on page 2 will show you how to incorporate other kinds of experiences that will expand your knowledge of your chosen field and make you a more desirable job candidate. The map is only a guideline. Speak with your advisor often to learn about new opportunities, clarify concerns, and develop a plan that is right for you.
